Southern states' representatives were to be willing to spend \$ for preliminary work but for actual construction under rights are settled in institutional amendment.

Palmdale area. — The Regional Planning Commission has adopted a zoning plan for the Northwest Concentration area containing 360 square miles. The proposed plan provides for reasonable expansion of the mountain communities, agricultural, industrial land and urban areas. Urban residential areas will be encouraged in the mountain areas.

Zoning for the greater part of the region now recognizes its use as open, undeveloped, agricultural land with scattered agricultural uses. The area includes the 1,000-foot sections of the San Joaquin and the Antelope National Forests, western Los Angeles County, the foothills of the south end of the San Joaquin and western part of the San Joaquin National Forest near Lake Elizabeth, consisting of Sections 19, 28, 29, 32, 33 and the east one-half of Section 6, T. 7N., R. 14W., S. 32, 33.

A further public hearing will be held before the Board of Supervisors prior to the final adoption of the proposed zoning plan.
