

Despite the threat of dissension by Palmdale Irrigation District, plans for forming a municipal water dstrict and holding the AVEK Empire Water Day on June 6 were being carried forth this wook by Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Fish Association

1. Announcement by directoes of the Palmdale Irrigation District that they intend to exclude their district from the proposed municipal water

2. Acceptance by Governor Edmund G. "Put" Brown of the invitation to be the guest of honor at the Empire Water

Day here.

3. Receipt of a letter by AV EK Water Basin Association from Harvey O. Banks, director of the Department of Water Resources for the State of California, spessing the importance of early formation of an overall water district in the Antelope Valley-East Kein area to negotiate with the State for supplemental water. 4. Resignation of C. Virgil

Davis as president of the wa-ter basin association, due to press of personal business, and the naming of R. B. McNutt to head the group.
