Cross-Defendant and Cross-Complainant, ANTELOPE VALLEY UNITED MUTUAL GROUP ("AVUMG") and Cross-Defendants, ADAMS BENNETT INVESTMENTS, LLC ("ADAMS BENNETT"), and MIRACLE IMPROVEMENT CORPORATION dba Golden Sands Mobile Home Park aka Golden Sands Trailer Park [ROE 1121] ("GOLDEN SANDS"), SERVICE ROCK PRODUCTS, L.P. ("SERVICE ROCK"), SHEEP CREEK WATER COMPANY, INC. ("SHEEP CREEK") and ST. ANDREW'S ABBEY, INC. [ROE 623] ("ST. ANDREW'S"), by and through their attorneys of record, Gresham Savage Nolan & Tilden, APC, by Michael Duane Davis, Esq. and Marlene L. Allen-Hammarlund, Esq. hereby submit their Case Management / Status Conference Statement for June 19, 2012.

AVUMG, ADAMS BENNETT, GOLDEN SANDS, SHEEP CREEK, SERVICE ROCK and ST. ANDREW'S have actively participated in the proceedings to date, including those conducted before Justice Ronald Robie and at AVEK and elsewhere in the Antelope Though these mediation and negotiation efforts are certainly not complete, much Valley. progress has been made on many major issues, and cause for optimism remains that these efforts will ultimately prove to be fruitful. There are however, a few issues that remain stumbling blocks. These issues, for the most part, are affected by the financial and logistical difficulties associated with the acquisition, storage and distribution of sufficient supplemental water to meet the needs of the parties in light of sound management practices. Finding solutions for these issues will be critical to completing the development of the [draft] Judgment and Physical Solution.

Recently, these parties attended a meeting at which representatives of the United States Geological Survey ("USGS") and engineers who represent major parties in this action reported on recent scientific developments and potentialities for improving the conditions in and management of the Antelope Valley Basin. Though the specifics of the presentations are protected by the Mediation Privilege, it is worthwhile mentioning that the parties appear to find themselves on the verge of a historic point where concrete plans for significantly improving the hydrologic conditions in the Basin and managing certain aspects of Basin operations will shortly

be able to be developed. In fact, the projections for these scientists being able to report their analyses and findings back to the group, was roughly sixty (60) to ninety (90) days. While it is certainly important that this litigation continue to proceed apace, it is equally important that the parties and this Court take full advantage of these recent advanced in scientific understanding and potentially meritorious Basin management options and plans.

These parties respectfully request that this Court allow sufficient time for the promised analyses to be completed and presented to the Parties so that they can utilize that information in completing the development of the [draft] Judgment and Physical Solution.

Furthermore, recent filings evidence other problems being faced by the parties who have been actively involved in the mediations and negotiations. These problems also need to be rectified in order for the efforts of the parties to develop a [draft] Judgment and Physical Solution, circulate it amongst the parties for approval, and finally bring it to the Court for adoption, to be completed.

Should this Court, however, determine to set the next phase of trial in this action without waiting for that information, these parties respectfully request that the Court conduct the next phase of trial on the issues of Prescription and Return Flows, followed by proving up the Parties' Claimed Rights.
