7 9:00 a.m., in Room 222 of the Superior Court of the County of Los Angeles, before the  
8 Honorable Jack Komar, presiding.

9 Moving Parties appeared by Michael Duane Davis, Esq. of Gresham Savage Nolan &  
10 Tilden, a Professional Corporation. Appearances for other appearing parties are reflected in the  
11 Court's Minute Order for this hearing.

12 Having considered the moving and opposing papers filed in connection with this Motion,  
13 and the arguments of counsel both for and in opposition to the Motion, and that sufficient  
14 evidence was presented to the Court in support of the Motion, and

15 **GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFORE,**

16 The Court hereby interprets its December 23, 2015 Judgment in this Adjudication, which  
17 Judgment was entered by filing with the Clerk of Court on December 28, 2015 and incorporated  
18 and adopted the [Proposed] Judgment and Physical Solution ("Physical Solution") attached as  
19 Exhibit "A" thereto (the entirety of the Judgment being referred to herein as the "Judgment"), as  
20 follows:

21 1. The Judgment requires that the organizational rules of the Watermaster must be  
22 fully established, including reasonable organizational procedures for the initial selection of the  
23 individuals to hold the two landowner Watermaster seats (referred to herein as the "Landowner  
24 Seats"), before the initial Watermaster Board can be seated and before it can appoint the  
25 Watermaster Engineer.

26 2. The Physical Solution contained within the Judgment precludes public agencies,  
27 including public agencies listed in Exhibit 4 to the Physical Solution, from holding either of the  
28 two Landowner Seats and from voting in the selection of the individuals holding either of the

1 two Landowner Seats, including in the event that a public agency acquires some or all of the  
2 Overlying Production Rights of a Party listed in Exhibit 4.

3 3. The Judgment requires that the two Landowner Seats provide broad-based  
4 representation of the private landowners on Exhibit 4, by way of representation of those diverse  
5 and distinct interests, described by categories of the private landowners' water uses, namely: (1)  
6 domestic water use; (2) agricultural/irrigation use; (3) commercial/industrial use; and (4)  
7 recreational use.

8 4. This Order interprets but does not in any way modify, alter, amend or otherwise  
9 disrupt the Judgment or any provision of the Judgment.
