## MINUTE ORDER RE: ADA APPLICATION FOR MR. JOSEPH SCALMANINI

The written application of Los Angeles County Water Works District 40 and the City of Los Angeles concerning Joseph Scalmanini pursuant to California Rule of Court 1.100 and the Americans with Disabilities Act was filed late on January 3, 2011 and was received by the trial judge after 9 p.m. on that date. Medical support for the request was provided to the Court at the time of the hearing on January 4, 2011 at 9 a.m.

The Court concluded that even if Rule 1.100 and the ADA apply, the request is unreasonable, would severely prejudice the other parties to the proceeding in their ability to coherently cross examine all witnesses, would unreasonably alter the Court's ability to administer the trial proceedings in a manner that would be just to all parties, and would cause the trial to be extended unreasonably.

The Court concluded that the Mr. Scalmanini is a material and crucial witness for the applicants and that Mr. Scalmanini must therefore be accommodated so that his testimony may be presented. The Court ordered that a videotaped deposition be made of his direct testimony at the law offices of Best, Best and Krieger in the town of Walnut Creek, California with all counsel who wish to cross examine be present thereat for his examination pursuant to the Code of Civil Procedure. The Video Tape of the examination and cross examination will be played in open court during the continued trial in this case subject to individual objections to questions and testimony given.

Further trial proceedings are continued to January 31, 2011 at 9:00 a.m. in the Los Angeles County Superior Court in a courtroom to be determined.
