PROPOSED ORDER REMANDING ISSUE OF ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS TO COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES

On or about June 3, 2008, Richard Wood filed a class action complaint in the Los Angeles County Superior Court and was assigned case Number BC 391869. Thereafter, on or about February 19, 2001 the case was ordered consolidated and coordinated with what came to be known as the Antelope Valley Coordinated Cases, with Judicial Council Number JCP 4408 assigned to it and Los Angeles Superior Court Number BC 325 201.

Subsequently, a judgment was entered in the coordinated cases on December 28, 2015 and thereafter an appeal was filed on behalf of the Wood Class and Los Angeles County Water District 40. The judgment was affirmed by the Court of Appeal and review denied by the California Supreme Court.

After Judgment was entered in 2015, Michael McLachlan moved to recover attorneys' fees and costs from Los Angeles County Waterworks District 40, a party to the litigation and the court entered an order ruling on the motion, granting certain fees and costs. Both Mr. McLachlan and Los Angeles Waterworks District 40 appealed the order.

The Court of Appeal affirmed in part and reversed in part the attorneys' fee and cost order of April 25, 2016, and remanded for further proceedings. A remittitur was issued.

Los Angeles County Waterworks District 40 has sought review of the Court of Appeal decision on the issues of the attorneys' fees and costs and the Supreme Court has not yet ruled on the same as of the date of this order.

The Wood Class has filed a challenge under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 170.3 seeking to disqualify Judge Jack Komar (Retired) who has filed a responsive declaration refuting the basis for the disqualification. Judge Komar has also indicated he will request that the Chief Justice reassign the Wood Class attorneys' fee and cost issue to a different judge.

In lieu of that request to reassign the entire Wood Class judgment, which has not been

appealed and remains affirmed in all respects except for the attorneys' fees and cost issues, it is

proposed that the attorneys' fees and cost issues which are the subject of the remittitur be severed

and returned to the Los Angeles Superior Court pursuant to California Rule of Court 3.542 for

further hearing by a judge of the Los Angeles Superior Court. The proposed remand will be only

as to those issues identified in the Court of Appeal remittitur.

Counsel are requested to file and serve any written responses to the proposed remand of

the attorneys' fees and cost issues.

Accordingly, a hearing on the proposed remand to the Los Angeles Superior Court is scheduled

for November 12, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. by telephone through Court Call.
