

Antelope Valley Sets Water Problem Votes

LANCASTER — Next Tuesday will be water election day for many of Antelope Valley's residents, with four major elections involving water service to be held.

They are:

To determine annexation of about 10,000 acres to Los Angeles County Waterworks District 4, which serves Lancaster.

To determine establishment of a proposed Los Angeles County Waterworks District 34 to serve the Desert View Highlands area, a housing development west of Palmdale.

To determine annexation of the Acton area to the Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency, an agency established to contract for supplemental water from the Feather River Aqueduct.

To determine annexation of the Agua Dulce area to the AVEK agency.

In the Waterworks District 4 annexation election, 12 special precincts have been set up. The annexation involves a large portion of the Westside, extending from Los Angeles County's Fox Airfield on the north to the top of the Portal Ridge southwest of Quartz Hill.

This annexation proposal has been involved in a political hassle which has included George McLain, who heads the California Institute of Social Welfare, an organization devoted to the betterment of conditions for senior citizens.

The CISW is currently building the Portal Senior Citizens' Village in the Quartz Hill area.
