W. Spinarski spells out need for water

Wallace G. Spinarski, general Manager of Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency, pointed out the dire necessity of supplemental water for the valley and a yes vote on Proposition W at a luncheon meeting of Palmdale Board of Realtors in Howard Johnson's last Monday noon, October 16.

Spinarski flashed color-slides and answered ques-

tions in giving the facts of the need in the valley for supplemental water and facts on the dwindling of the water table of the valley...

In 1925

The pictures showed the water table of the valley in 1925 when water pushed out of the ground so plentiful was the water in days of lesser population here in 1925. Proof of the dwindling water table in 1940 was also depicted by the slides.

As farming and more houses were built in the valley the water dwindled to an extent causing the used water that returns to the sub-surface to become polluted.

Spinarski pointed out it will be a case of half of the people move out of the valley or, to have the supplemental water of the Agency System the Distribution System. At this point, Spinarski asked the question of his audience:

The Crisis "What happens when the well goes dry?"

The Answer

At the present time, Spinarski continued, it will cost \$6,000 per day whether or not the Agency System (Distribution System) is built. Our share is \$220 million. With the water from the Feather River we are assured of sufficient water to provide for the needs of business and people. When AVEK has the Agency System the farm-

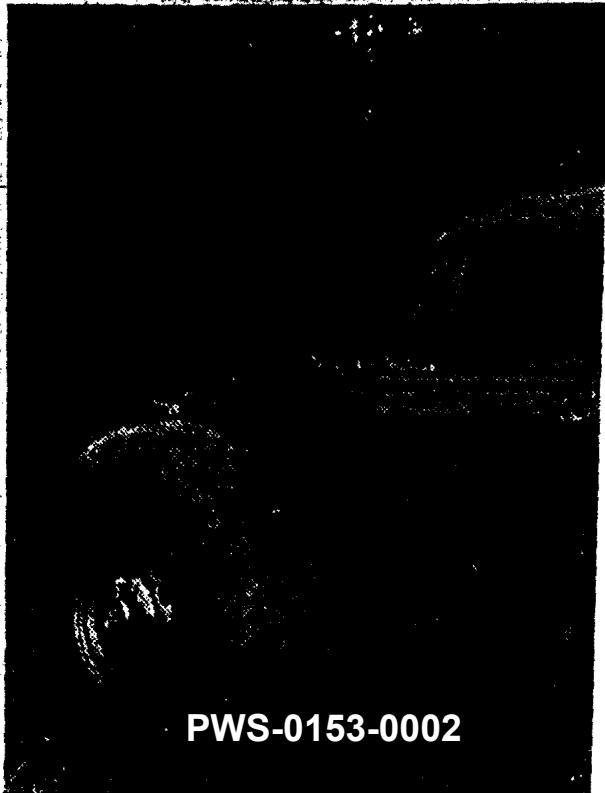
