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9 On July 29, 2013, a Case Management Conference regarding Phase V trial issues was
10 held in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Department 48, 111 North
11 Hill Street, Los Angeles, California 90012, the Honorable Jack Komar presiding. The
12 appearances are as stated in the record. The Court, having read and considered the supporting
13 and opposing papers, and having heard and considered the arguments of counsel, and good
14 cause appearing therefore, makes the following order:

15 In order to assist in framing up Phase V trial issues, the purveyor parties claiming
16 prescription are ordered to identify the legal theory, timeframe, factual and legal basis for each
17 purveyor claim as against each landowner, along with any other purveyor claim to
18 groundwater, such as purveyor overlying rights.

19 The parties are ordered to brief and file, no later than August 16, 2013, the right to jury
20 issues in a groundwater prescription case and whether jury trial rights are the same or different
21 in groundwater versus riparian prescriptive claims.

22 A Further Case Management Conference is set for September 6, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. in
23 the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles (courtroom to be determined).

24 Finally, the parties are ordered to meet and confer regarding a form of court ordered
25 discovery to clarify the legal theory, timeframe and factual and legal basis supporting the
26 prescription claims of each purveyor as against each landowner, along with any other purveyor
27 claim to groundwater, such as purveyor overlying rights. Once agreed to by the parties and
28 ordered by the Court, the court-ordered discovery will be subject to a separate order.

1 Finally, the Court urged the parties to continue with mediator efforts in an attempt to
2 resolve the case.
