Whereas it appears from a duly authenticated transcript filed in the General Land Office of the United States that pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Congress approved the third day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty one entitled an Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land claims in the State of California Jose Maria Flores as claimant filed his petition on the thirtieth day of October Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and fifty two with the commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land claims in the State of California sitting as a Board in the City of Los Angeles, before which petition he claimed the confirmation of his title to a tract of land containing eleven square leagues wherein by the name of La Loberia situated in the former jurisdiction of Santa Barbara and State of said, said claim being rejected on a Merit in Grant the following, made on the twenty-first day of April Anno Domini One thousand eight hundred and forty five by R. P. Rice then Constitutional Governor of the Department of the California, and whereas the Board of Land Commissioners aforesaid by decree entered on the second day of May Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and fifty four rejected said claim which decree or decision having been taken by appeal to the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, the said District Court at its December Term Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and fifty six in the cause styled Jose M. Flores appellant vs The United States appellee rendered its decision as follows to wit: It is ordered adjudged and decreed that the decision of said Board of Commissioners be and hereby is in full thing remanded and it is further adjudged and decreed that the claim of the appellant to the lands called La Loberia claimed in this case is good and valid and the same are hereby confirmed to him to the extent of eleven square leagues of land and more within the boundaries described in the Court below: the Rancho de Corleto on the North East the Loberia de la Bellota on the south and on the West, the plain of Los Alamos Provided, that should the quantity of land within said boundaries

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To the Honourable Senate & House, their confirmation is hereby made of such less greatly. And whereas the mandate of the Supreme Court of the United States dismissing the appeal of said cause entitled Jose Maria Flores v. U.S. ex. The United States App't having been filed in the aforesaid District Court the said District Court at a special term held on the sixth day of March Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and sixty two ordered that the order, made at the last term of this court, allowing an appeal in the case to vacate and arrest all and the claimant is allowed to have such further process as in the court as may be necessary or usual on a final decree whereby the proceedings of court upon this cause shall be conclusive. And whereas it further appears that this cause was brought before the District Court of United States for the District of California Southern District in the matter of Survey and Location as follows to wit: Jose Maria Flores vs the United States No 170. In the matter of the Survey of "La Loma". The District Attorney of the United States for said Southern District having ordered the Survey of said Rancho as made by George N Thompson U.S. Deputy Surveyor in the month of July 1862, into Court, and no exceptions having been filed thereto by the claimants or the United States or any other person and it appearing to the court that the said first Survey in all respects conforms to the grant and to the decree of confirmation in this case, now on motion of Patterson & Stow of Counsel for claimant and consent of Hon. W. C. Whitney U.S. District Attorney of said Southern District. It is ordered and decreed that the said Survey, made by George N Thompson U.S. Deputy Surveyor in the Month of July 1862. and the same is hereby in all things affirmed and approved, and it is further ordered that no appeal be allowed by the U.S. or any other person or persons from this Decree made this 1st day of December A.D. 1862, Fletcher McNaught, District Judge of the U.S. for Southern District of California. It is stipulated that the foregoing order be entered and that appeal therefrom to the United States Supreme Court, be dismissed. Dated Nov^r 18th 1862.

Thence Township line north two hundred chains to post on quarter section corner marked L.L. N° 27. Station. Thence north through sections Thirtysix one and Thirtysix one hundred and sixty chains to post on quarter section corner marked L.L. N° 28. Station. Thence East between Sections nineteen and Thirtysix at two chains and twenty-five links crosses ravine course south Sixty-one degrees east. less chains and fifty links to top of brushy hill thence along on same about forty chains crosses sections nineteen twenty twenty-nine and thirty. Thence between sections Twenty and Twenty-nine at forty-five chains descends hill at Seventy-five chain ends Tijon canon course north and about eighty-five chains to Tijon creek fifteen links wide. Course south four degrees east at eighty-six chains ascends to bluff bank fifty feet high at hundred chains to post in rock mound marked L.L. N° 29. Station. N° 34. Station. Thence south Sixty degrees and thirty minutes west along the side of brushy broken hills two hundred and nine chains and forty links to a Pine tree Twenty inches in diameter marked L.L. N° 35. Station at the head of Oak Creek Canyon from which an oak tree Thirty inches in diameter bears east two chains and four links distant. Thence south forty-nine degrees and forty-five minutes west to a chain post near Tijon

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

Station. Four chains and fifty links distant from Spring under rock in the head of Riley Cañon Thence South fifty seven degrees and forty five minutes West over rugged mountain Two hundred and seventy eight chains and eighty five links to point of beginning and containing forty eight Thousand seven hundred and ninety nine ^{1/4} acres and being along lot on the plat of public surveys as Lot no Thirty seven, Township eight, North Range Section west. Lot no Sixty Seven Township eight North Range sixteen West. Lot n^o Sixty Seven Township eight north. Range eighteen West. Lot n^o Thirty seven Township nine North Range seventeen West. Lot n^o Sixty seven Township nine North Range eighteen West. Lot n^o Thirty seven, Township Seven North Range fifteen West and. 
