This cause coming on to be heard on appeal from the decision of the United States Board of Land Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California under an act of Congress approved March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1851, on a Transcript of the Proceedings and Decisions of said Board of Commissioners, and of the papers and evidence upon which said Decision was founded, and on additional evidence filed before this Court, and it appearing to the Court that said transcript and the notice of appeal have been duly filed according to law, and counsel for the respective parties having been heard.

"A" It is ordered, adjudged and decreed that the Decision of said Board of Commissioners be and here is in all things reversed.

And it is further adjudged and decreed that the claim of the Appellant to the lands called "Liebre" claimed in this case is good and valid, and the same are hereby confirmed to him to the extent of Eleven square leagues of land, and no more, within the boundaries described in the Grant, to wit: the "Salinas de Cortes" on the North East, the "Cuesta de la Bellot" on the South and on the West, the place of Los Alamos.

Provided that should the quantity of land within said boundaries be less than Eleven square leagues, then confirmation is hereby made of such less quantity.

This done is signed in open Court this 12th February 1857.
