	SECOND AMENDMENT TO CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER FOR PHASE FOUR TRIAL	

## IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

The Case Management Order For Phase 4 Trial (the "CMO"), dated December 12, 2012, as amended by the First Amendment to the CMO, dated January 17, 2013, is further amended as follows:

## Conduct of Depositions for Phase Four Trial

Amount of Notice: No deposition will be noticed on less than 5 court days' notice. Simultaneous Tracking of Depositions: Depositions shall not be noticed so as result in double-tracking if there is an objection filed by a party to such double-tracking on or before 5 p.m. the second court day after service of the double-tracked deposition notice.

Scheduling: Deposition scheduling will be coordinated through the liason committee, which will designate two members as the primary points of contact for scheduling. The noticing party for any deposition will notify the case manager at the court reporting agency selected by the litigants (Veritext) by electronic mail of any notices issued or changes to deposition dates or times within four hours of posting any deposition notice. The assigned case manager at Veritext is Shay Tyler, who can be reached at <a href="mailto:styler@veritext.com">styler@veritext.com</a>, or 213-623-5005.

Location: All depositions will occur in Los Angeles County, unless Veritext can confirm a video link and the deposition exhibits can be made available to all interested parties at least 24 hours before the start of the deposition.

Scope of Depositions: The depositions will be limited to those matters reasonably related to the scope of the Phase Four trial and the evidence anticipated to be proffered by the party producing the witness in question.

One Deposition Rule: The Phase Four depositions do not limit any party's ability to take depositions in later phases of trial.

1	Preparation of Deposition Transcripts for trial: The party taking any deposition	
2	shall ensure that the transcript for that deposition is produced by the court reporter at least	
3	five court days prior to the commencement of trial.
