On June 17, 2005, a series of pending groundwater lawsuits were ordered
 coordinated as Judicial Council Coordination Proceeding 4408, which was
 assigned to Los Angeles County Superior Court, Complex Litigation division. The
 Judicial Council assigned Judge Jack Komar to sit on assignment and preside
 over JCCP 4408, which was given the title "Antelope Valley Groundwater Cases."

On or about June 3, 2008, Richard Wood filed a class action complaint in
the Los Angeles County Superior Court and was assigned case Number BC391869
(*Wood v. Los Angeles County Waterworks District 40 et al.*). Thereafter, the *Wood* case was transferred and coordinated with JCCP 4408. On or about
February 19, 2010, the Antelope Valley Groundwater Cases, including the *Wood*case, were consolidated for trial.

On December 28, 2015, a judgment was entered in the coordinated cases. After Judgment was entered, class counsel, Law Offices of Daniel M. O'Leary and McLachlan Law, APC (the firm's current name), filed two motions to recover attorneys' fees and costs from the defendants, including Los Angeles County Waterworks District 40. The Court entered orders on the fee motions, granting certain fees and costs.

Thereafter, both the Wood Class and Los Angeles County Water District 40 18 filed a series of cross-appeals relating to the post-judgment orders on attorneys' 19 fees and costs, and issues directly related thereto, e.g. a Government Code 20 election for periodic payments. The Court of Appeal for the Fifth Appellate 21 District affirmed in part and reversed in part the attorneys' fee and cost orders 22 and remanded for further proceedings. Los Angeles County Waterworks District 23 40 sought review of the Court of Appeal decision on the issues of the attorneys' 24 fees and costs and the Supreme Court denied review. On December 6, 2021, the 25 Court of Appeal issued remittitur. 26

On September 29, 2021, the Wood Class filed a Statement of Disqualification pursuant to C.C.P. section 170.3. On October 4, 2021, Judge
