Quartz Hill Water District objects to the self-designated "AGWA" proposed Third Amendment to Case Management Order for Phase Four trial as follows:

### T. THE PROPOSED ORDER DOES NOT CONFORM TO THE ORDER STATED BY THE COURT

At the hearing on March 1, 2013, this court stated that a party noticing a deposition would also need to state the general grounds of the deposition, analogous to the procedure for a deponent who is not a natural person, *aka* a person most knowledgeable.

The court expressed an intention to limit the examination of the upcoming depositions to the subject matters of the Phase 4 trial.

The proposed order proposed by the "AGWA" group does not conform to the specific requirements of the court's order on March 1<sup>st</sup>. Nor does the proposed order set forth the intention of the court to limit the scope of the depositions to the matters of the Phase 4 trial.

The proposed order requires that all deposition notices for overlying parties specify by declaration item number the topics which the deposition questions will address and the nature of the inquiry. This is improper, and is the equivalent to requiring a party to provide the questions to the deponents ahead of time.

It is also unduly restrictive and will cause the undue consumption of time. Parties will need to review each paragraph of the declaration before sending the depositions notice, even if, based upon other factors, that witness will be deposed. If issues arise during the deposition that relate to a paragraph that was not specified, then the implication of this order is that the deposition would need to be continued, to give time to re-notice on that issue.

This court order should simply require the deposition notice to describe with reasonable particularity the matters on which examination is requested. The examination should be limited to the subject matters of the Phase 4 trial.

An alternative proposed order amending the case management order is included with this opposition.
